

Keep Sugar Land Beautiful is offering a self-guided tour of historic Sugar Land on Saturday.

In most cases, visitors will not have admission to the homes, but a sign posted on the site will explain its historical significance, said Melissa Hoffman, group executive director. Tours will be open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Some sites no longer have a building, but photographs will show visitors what the previous structure looked like, said Jane M. Goodsill, 50, chairwoman of Touring Historic Sugar Land-2003.

The historic sites will be along and either side of U.S. 90A. Goodsill said a particular emphasis is placed on the area known as "The Hill." Most of the sites and buildings recognized will be in the architecture of the early 20th century, Goodsill said. One of the tour

sites is the home of M.R. Woods, who came to Sugar Land to be the chemist in the sugar refinery and eventually rose to plant superintendent.

Tickets will be available at the Lakeview School Auditorium, 314 Lakeview Drive in Sugar Land, the day of the event for \$5. Food will be sold. The tour will include 33 sites of homes, churches, business and unimproved land.

The auditorium also will house displays and presentations. Memorabilia collected by Scotty Hightower Bass from Historic Sugar Land will be on display as well as a 30-foot-by-60-foot miniarurization of the Sugar Land community as it looked in 1951. During the day, a collection of antique cars will be displayed in the auditorium parking lot.

The noon audio/visual presentation called "Voices from the Past" includes historical stories of Sugar Land from before it was incorporated as a city in 1959.

"We have some old tapes and

videos and VHS of people who are beloved in the community. We'll be showing them," Goodsill said. "We'll be showing the moving of the railroad depot. We'll be showing the origins of Fort Bend Independent School District."

At 1 p.m., a program will include the less well-known and humorous aspects of the city's operation since it was incorporated. It will include five former mayors and the present mayor. Last year, one of the former mayors told about the city's decision to become computerized. After a computer was loaded into the back of his car, he drove around for three weeks because everyone was too scared to get it out and open it, Goodsill said.

At 2 p.m. an original play written and produced by The Cast Theatrical Company of Rosenberg will present "Refined Sugar." It is based on a series of interviews with longtime women residents as collected by Kristin Lytle.

Saturday, May 3 Second Annual Touring Historic Sugar Land

Bring your family to Lakeview Elementary (tentative location due to construction) to learn more about the rich history of Sugar Land and help raise funds for environmental education and conservation efforts. Local actors will bring history to life, long-time residents will share their memories of the good old days both in person and on video, a map will be available for a self-guided walk, the Sugar Land Area Artists will exhibit their wares and food will be available for purchase.


#### Touring Historic Sugar Land




## Refined Sugar
